# STEPHEN MINISTRY PROGRAM

---

Stephen Ministry Training is set to begin at Good Shepherd in mid September.

This logo symbolizes that we are all broken people and it is only through the cross of Jesus that we can be made whole. As we ponder our mission statement and how we can best “SHOW Christ’s love to the world”, being a Stephen Minister is the best example in fulfilling this act. Caring for people in need or crisis is at the heart of a congregation’s ministry. Pastors and congregations exhaust themselves trying to meet these needs, but their best efforts often fall short.



- The Pastor(s) and staff don’t have enough hours in a week to care for all the members who are hurting, much less reach out to nonmembers who are hurting as well.
- When a pastor provides immediate care at the onset of a crisis, he is often unable to provide ongoing follow-up care.
- Needs for care might go unnoticed and unmet.
- Lay people want to help but typically lack the knowledge, skills and confidence to care effectively.
- Those whose needs for care go unmet can struggle in faith and even stop participating in the congregation.

Involving well-chosen, trained and supervised lay people is a natural, highly effective and thoroughly biblical way to meet the growing needs for care within a congregation – and to reach out with Christ’s love to hurting people who have no church home.

A Testimonial:

*“After her two sons were killed in an automobile accident, Marilyn found the most difficult part of grief was that friends avoided talking about her sons – for fear that they would upset her. “I had no one to talk to about them. It was as if they had never existed,” Marilyn said. “Then I was matched with a Stephen Minister. She was patient, she was caring, she was accepting. And when she rang my doorbell, I knew I could open up and talk about my sons and the overwhelming grief I was experiencing. My Stephen Minister was an ‘angel on my doorstep’. God worked through her to heal my pain.”*

With Stephen Ministry, people no longer have to go through crises and difficulties alone. It is a way for the church to fully **BE** the body of Christ.

## Good Shepherd/Hanley Shared Ministry Project

---

Good Shepherd’s May Newsletter reported on the opportunity being considered for Good Shepherd and Hanley Evangelical Lutheran Church to enter into a relationship to share ministry and resources.

Good Shepherd committee members, Barrie Bergsma, Fran Seidler, Joan Meyer and Pastor Harley had an opportunity to meet with Hanley members Calvin Grindheim, Cathy Thall and Elaine Hanson along with Assistant to the Bishop, Pastor Roger Haugen. The committee has also had an opportunity to meet with Good Shepherd’s Church Management Team (CMT).

The proposed gift of this relationship offers many positives for both congregations:

- Hanley has the opportunity to engage young people/couples as they return to live within this rural community and the stability of having a constant pastoral relationship
- Good Shepherd is at the end of an Internship contract and requires additional personnel resources to meet the needs of a young, growing congregation.
- The benefit for both congregations is a longer term relationship of a full-time person, rather than the constant change of part-time or student assistance.

A shared Ministry between these two congregations would provide for:

- Hanley to receive consistent Sunday Services; a full day of pastoral care and presence within their community each week; regular institutional visitation of their members in Saskatoon; opportunities to participate in confirmation, Stephan Ministries and other learning opportunities with Good Shepherd and constant contact with a pastoral team for emergencies, funerals, and weddings.
- Good Shepherd to receive an ordained pastoral team member for 3 days a week to complement the strong ministry already offered through the congregation; an opportunity to share the rich musical heritage of the congregation with a shared ministry partner and an opportunity to build a relationship that will welcome rural member's if/when they transition into Saskatoon.

A Covenant for Shared Ministry would propose:

- An introductory term agreement of two years with subsequent reviews every two years.
- The Clergy team would be called through Good Shepherd, in consultation with Hanley for the addition of the new team member.
- The financial obligations for the clergy team would be supported by Good Shepherd contributing 3/4 share and Hanley the balance of 1/4 of the full cost of the clergy team.
- Each council would appoint members to a joint committee to assist in the ongoing ministry of this shared relationship.

Financial Implications:

- Pastor Harley plus a newly ordained clergy person would require a contribution of \$7,940/month by Good Shepherd and \$2,647/month by Hanley. (This is an increase of approximately \$650/month for current services with an Intern for Good Shepherd and an increase of approximately \$450/month for Hanley over what their clergy costs were last fiscal year.)
- If a clergy person with approximately four years of experience was called contributions rates would increase to \$8,340/month for Good Shepherd and \$2,780/month for Hanley.

The Committee would appreciate a response from congregational members regarding the concept of entering a Shared Ministry between Good Shepherd and Hanley.

There is a song that I enjoy listening to. This song was cool years back when I thought I was cool, and I first heard the song at YC back when I was a teenager. The song is "Blitz" by Audio Adrenaline, and it is about a group of 14 kids in an old church van and the adventures that they had. This past weekend, driving the big van, inching along the 'Wayne Gretzky' drive and seeing the arena in the distance, this song came to mind. I thought of all the adventures I had as a youth taking our trips to YC in Red Deer and Edmonton. I also thought of the moment on May 16<sup>th</sup> 1997 when God became a reality for me at YC'97. I wasn't much different than the Good Shepherd youth who filled, rocked, energized and stunk up the van. 13 years ago, I took a chance with 7 youth from my home church, piled into our old cars and headed to this YC thing, and the Holy Spirit moved. I was excited for our youth, for what awaited them once the conference began.
